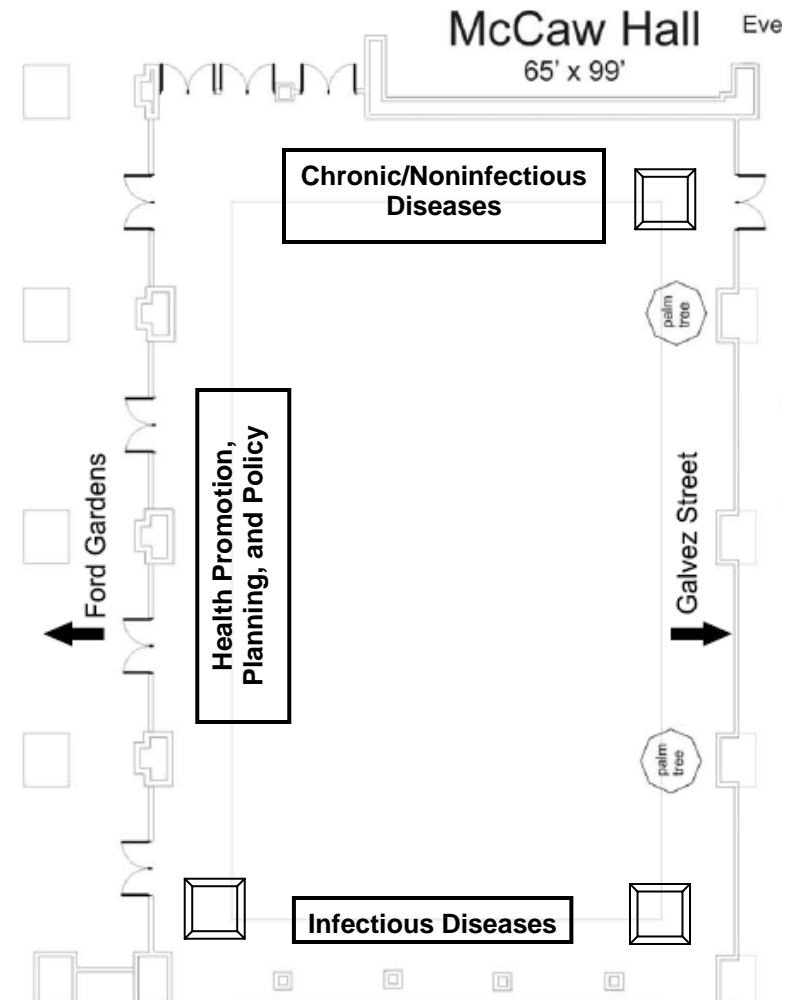

Keynote Address



Dr. Lisa Pratt is currently the Chief Physician & Surgeon at San Quentin State Prison. She oversees the care of 5400 inmates. By combining direct patient care, administrative oversight, leadership on policy issues and physician education, Dr. Pratt works to improve the health care of one of our most vulnerable populations. Dr. Pratt is also the Medical Director for Detoxification Services at Baker

Places where she directs a residential drug and alcohol detoxification program for medically indigent patients.

Prior to working for San Quentin, Dr. Pratt was a consultant with UCSF's Correctional Medicine Consultation Network (CMCN). With a team from CMCN, Dr. Pratt reviewed the medical care provided at the 33 state prisons in California, which is currently in federal receivership in order to create an academic/correctional medicine partnership throughout California. She led the overall analysis and redesign of the intake system at San Quentin, developed clinical protocols and low literacy assessment tools, and precepted UCSF residents.

Dr. Pratt was formerly the Medical Director of the San Francisco Community Clinic Consortium, a network of ten community clinics in San Francisco. Her work here included the creation of a system-wide Continuous Quality Improvement program, integration of medical care and health policy activities within the Safety Net system of care in San Francisco that included management of chronic conditions and implementation of a disease management registry across systems of care in San Francisco.

Dr. Pratt graduated with a BS from Tufts University, where she also received her MD and MPH degrees. She completed her residency training at University of California, San Francisco and is board certified in Internal Medicine and Addiction Medicine.
